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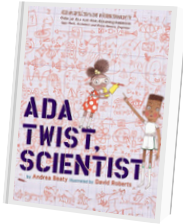
Why Curiosity Matters

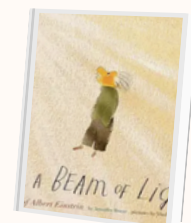

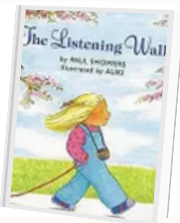

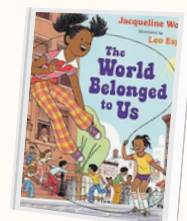

For Teachers:

For Parents:

Ask open-ended questions, take noticing walks, keep a family wonder journal, celebrate children's questions.
